#### **FPC Building Committee Update**



The Committee narrowed the list of possible <u>Construction Management Firms</u> down to four. Each of the firms were interviewed in early October. We are pleased to announce we have selected <u>Halfacre Construction Company</u> as our CMF. We relied strongly on the professionals at Zoller-Autrey and Crowley Services in selecting this firm.

Once all the Professional Firms are in place, the next step is preconstruction services. This process involves Design/Scope Review and Cost Estimating. If everything goes accordingly, we are hoping to begin construction in the  $2^{nd}$  Quarter of 2019.



- (3) Defining and caring for yourself
- (4) Relating to family and friends
- (5) Spiritual matters

#### PW Bible Study "God's Promise: I Am With You"

"God is with Us in Our Discouragement." The root of the word "courage" is "cor" which is the Latin word for "heart." When we are discouraged, we are disheartened either through fear, opposition, weariness or frustration. Two of God's chosen emissaries were Joshua and Haggai, one was to lead the Israelites to the promised land after Moses' death, and Haggai who was to lead the people in rebuilding the temple when they returned from exile. We may stand at the shore of our own Jordan fearing to step into a new job, relocating, awaiting a medical test or we may be discouraged with a family crisis, raising a teenager, or overwhelmed with every day life. Yet God tells us in Joshua 1:9 "I [the Lord] hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go...I will never leave you nor forsake you."

Remember that the Lord is present and active in your life. Turn to Him in time of plenty and in time of need. For further background scriptures, please read Deuteronomy 31:1-8; Joshua 1:1-9; Haggai 1:1-15; 2:1-9.

Care Net is one of the many Mission Committee's outreach to the community. Their Director, Kelly Matson, shared their Mission: Acknowledging that every human life begins at conception and is worthy of protection. Care Net Manasota Pregnancy Center offers compassion, hope, and help to anyone considering abortion by presenting them with realistic alternative and Christ-centered support.

Care Net has been in existence for twenty one years now and has come a long way. So far in 2018, Care Net has had 90 babies born to their clients; 208 sonograms performed (ultrasounds); 2,129 items distributed from the Baby Boutique; 794 "Earn While You Learn" classes conducted; 1,336 total appointments; 342 new clients seen; 1 beautiful adoption; and 25 babies saved from abortion.

Susan Vorpahl, of FPC, has taken it on as a personal endeavor to procure diaper bags, fill them with necessary baby items, i.e. diapers, ointment, wash cloths, one outfit (infant up to 24 months), baby bottle, lotion and soap. She usually delivers three per month. Lately, Care Net has had a shortage of diapers and wipes so for the past few months Susan has been supplying these items to them. Any donations of this type are gratefully accepted.

All of Care Net services are provided for free, i.e. pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, one-on-one counseling, medical, legal and social service referrals within the community. Classes such as parenting education, medically accurate education on all choices available, and others. Women/girls go through the "Earn While You Learn" program – earning points towards baby clothes, diaper bags, diapers, strollers and cribs. Topics available through "Earn While You Learn" are basic decision making, prenatal care, the first trimester through the third, etc.

Oct. 23, 2018


