WHAT IS A CIRCLE?

Most members would say it's a place for making new friends and enjoying old friends. A Circle is a group of women who meet once a month either morning or evening. We visit for a while to catch up and we often have a treat. The leader of the Circle will let everyone know what is happening within our church and within our larger Presbytery.

The primary purpose of Circles is Bible study, with studies designed for easy reading while providing insight into our daily Christian life. Our Bible studies are perfect for those of us who are well-versed in the Bible and for those of us who have trouble finding any book past Genesis. They're perfect for those who like to do homework and complete two or three fill in the blanks and for those of us who prefer just to discuss the lesson with their Circle. Our Circles are a safe place for us to study God's Word, applying it to our daily lives through open and honest discussion. Both Circles have excellent instructors, and you will never be asked to read or pray aloud unless you would like to.

There are no secret handshakes at Circle and we encourage you to bring a friend! Our Circles are filled with women whose needs are constantly changing and who are using Biblical study to guide our way. Our Circles are places of safety, comfort, learning, laughter and love.
