A fresh look at the Ten Commandments

Lesson Eight: Words of Love: Speak Truthfully

The Presbyterian Women's Bible Study for this month is on the Ninth Word, the 9th Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor." (Exodus 20:16). In order to live in a stable community, it is necessary to practice basic honesty. This commandment concerns false witnessing, or perjury, while being under oath. A person's words can be an outright lie or deception. We are not to speak words that cause harm or injury to another by causing the person to look bad or lower his self-esteem. To be a false witness is to claim something is true when the person was not even present. False testimony is saying something is true when it is not. This system of justice was to protect the poor and most vulnerable in society. So to prevent this from happening a rule was instituted that at least two witnesses had to testify in agreement.

Sometimes bosses tried to take economic advantage over workers by claiming they worked fewer hours or did substandard work. This problem has happened especially in farmworker communities within recent years.

In the Torah lying is permitted to save someone's life as in the case of Rahab when she lied to the king's men to protect Joshua and others (Joshua 2). Other stories also demonstrate that God's people had the freedom to lie to save a life, avoid injury, or to protect someone from being taken advantage of. Yet telling the truth is a form of loving one's neighbor. We must remember that words spoken can never be unspoken.







Volunteers are needed for various duties and, most importantly, to provide comradery with the seafarers. Port Manatee is in a tremendous growth cycle with over 30% increase in ships in port, so volunteer assistance is always needed at Anchor House.
